Leaving St. Andrews isn't easy. It's a place where a love affair with love happens. But we were excited about being in Edinburgh and staying at the famous Balmoral Hotel. Balmoral is a marvelous Victorian structure that combines the noble character of a Scottish baronial home and the classic sophistication of an international hotel.

The hotel did not disappoint. Elegance is the best word to describe this wonderful experience. On the walk down the hallway, I saw rooms labeled for Sean Connery and Harry Potter author J.K. Rowling. On the first morning getting ready for playing Muirfield, what a surprise to find that the floor of the bathroom was heated. What a treat to step out of the shower onto a warm floor. The Balmoral was built in 1902 and they say it is a love letter to Edinburgh. It is located on Princes Street. Just down the block is the Johnnie Walker shop as you walk down the Royal Mile of stores with elegant clothes for sale.

After a wonderful full English breakfast, we traveled 45 minutes to Muirfield, the home course of the Honorable Company of Edinburgh Golfers, the world's oldest golf club.

In the morning, we played four balls (play your own ball) and then went into the locker room to change into coat and tie and lunch in the members' dining room. The lunch lived up to its reputation as the best buffet lunch in Scotland.

After returning to our golf clothes, we played an alternate shot round. The course is out in the country with few buildings on the horizon. It seemed odd that the pro shop consisted of a small space where the starter got us checked in but without loads of merchandise to sell. It is all a courteous and civilized ambiance to Muirfield. Returning to our hotel and the bustling city of Edinburgh, we ate outside and watched a crowd cheering for a soccer match being viewed on an enormous screen.

With so many great memories already during the trip, we approached the West Links of North Berwick Golf Club without too many expectations. But it turned out to be another highlight experience.

The course lies on the second oldest golfing ground in Scotland and features an ancient shepherd's wall as a part of its design.

So our fantasy golf trip was near an end. We leave behind the pot bunkers, the tall grasses in the rough, the warm greeting from the Scots and some great caddies. It was nine nights and eight rounds of golf.

My travel buddy Larry Levine, who just turned 85, has a tee time on the Old Course this June. Anyone interested? Before you go, I would recommend reading about the history of this game we love so much. I have a copy of "The Long Golden Afternoon, Golf's Age of Glory 1864-1914" by Stephen Proctor. But there are many others to read that will help make the experience of golfing in Scotland something very special.


